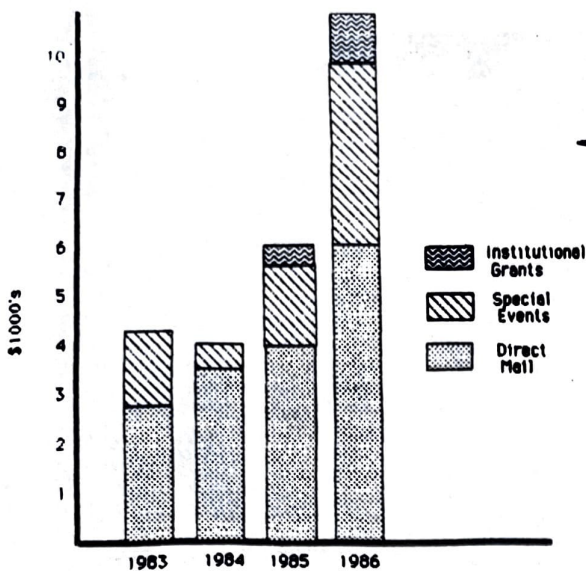

- The number of contributors has risen from 92 in 1983; 166 in 1984; 178 in 1985; 261 in 1986.

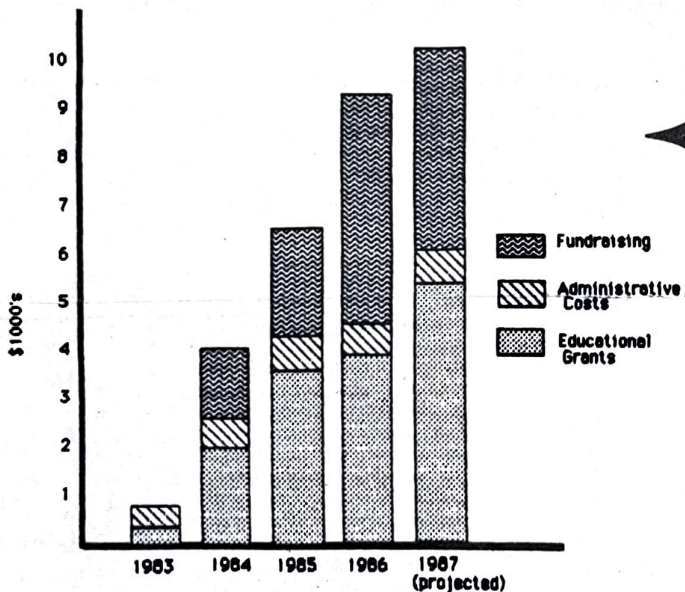
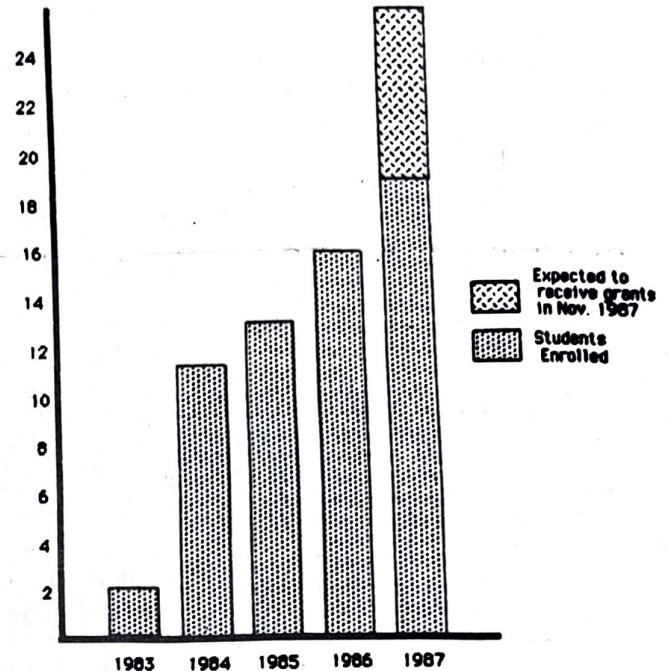


Students Receiving Grants

- As of the end of March 1987 PCAFPD has provided grants equal to 50 school years of education.

- In November 1987, PCAFPD plans to add 4 new scholars as grant recipients. Our total by the end of school year 1987 will be 23 students.

Expenses by Category

- Fundraising includes costs of printing and mailing the newsletter.

- Administrative amounts include necessary communication, photocopying and supply costs. All staff volunteer their time.

For every dollar spent on scholar support, the Foundation has had administrative costs of:

1984	37.5¢
1985	25.0¢
1986	15.7¢
1987(projected)	15.4¢

Our administrative costs are low and still decreasing. This is in spite of many stateside expenses, while all of the grants go to cover the relatively low cost of education in the Philippines. The Foundation has taken advantage, to the maximum extent possible, of lower Philippine costs by shipping administrative work overseas.

Continuing The Commitment Through The Combined Federal Campaign

In the next few months, the Federal Government will be launching its annual Combined Federal Campaign for Federal employees. The CFC allows Federal employees to register to contribute to any charitable health and welfare organization approved by the Internal Revenue Service as tax exempt.

Contributing to the CFC is easy. On their registration card, employees indicate their names and organization, the amount they want to contribute, and whether they will contribute with cash or through automatic payroll deductions. To designate a recipient, the employee indicates the name and mailing address of the charity. The employees' organization and CFC sponsor forward their contributions to the designated charities.

As a beneficiary of the CFC, we would like to thank all of you who have contributed to the Foundation. Please let us know if you contribute through CFC so we can keep you on our mailing list, as we receive only a lump check without a list of who contributed. You Can Be An Individual Sponsor

The Foundation now offers individuals and unincorporated groups the same opportunity it has offered the Bikol Association and other organizations: sponsorship of a particular student throughout his or her course of study. The sponsoring individual or group must simply:

- Agree to fund the Foundation selected individual for their duration of their program. (This is generally four years for an incoming freshman.)

The Foundation will:

- Select an appropriate scholar from among the many highly qualified and deserving applicants which apply every year from across the Philippines.
- Send you a copy of the scholar's application and a photograph.
- Bill you once or twice annually depending on your preference.
- Provide copies of selected correspondence between Foundation and scholar.
- Provide a brief annual review of the students progress including grades.

Based on the last five years of operations, we have learned that the average cost of financing the education of a college student in the Philippines is \$280 per year. You will be billed only \$280 until your scholar graduates even if the dollar cost of education rises. That is, the Foundation is removing the risk you would have to carry if you were paying for someone's education directly over several years. Your payments will not change; the Foundation will absorb any cost increases.
